
Our Learning This Week.....Class 2

In PE this week, we have thoroughly enjoyed our tag rugby sessions. We have been dodging attackers and scoring tries. The staff are also immensely proud of all of the children for their progress in swimming. Some of the children have been swimming across the pool without their pool noodles and have even jumped in at the deep end of the pool. It has been a real pleasure to watch them progress so quickly and enjoy taking part with such confidence and enthusiasm, practising skills which are essential in ensuring their safety in and around water.



In Science, the children have been trying very hard to remember the names of the bones in the human body. They have collected data by measuring bones. The year 5/6s have even calculated the mean average and suggested why some results seemed to be anomalous.


- If you have not done so already please return your parents evening slip to the school office. Appointments will be sent home next week.
