Our Learning This Week.....Class 1

On Monday, Class 1 enjoyed a day in the forest in the sunshine. We collected lots of different coloured leaves that we found over the school field. We sorted the leaves into a graph to see which was the most common colour at the moment. We talked about the colours we found and why most of these were brown or green. We then sorted our leaves into size and made a strip of leaves which grew in size each time. In the afternoon, the children had a fantastic time making dens in groups.

In English, the children have written their own story based around the book *Stardust* about a character who was jealous of someone and how this makes them feel. I am sure the children would love to share these with you.

In Maths, the children have been concentrating on addition and practising number bonds which will help them as numbers get larger. Number bonds are two numbers that add together to make another number e.g $7+3 = 10$.

Yesterday, we also had a visit from North Yorkshire Fire Service, who gave a talk to all the children about Dark Nights, Bonfire and General Fire Safety.



Our Learning This Week.....Class 2

This week, we have written beautiful autumn themed poems. The children really embraced the structure of the poem and used some beautiful vocabulary. They presented their work altering the text and images and have produced some stunning pieces.


In History, we have looked at how children's lives have changed. The children have really enjoyed this unit of work and are feeling rather grateful for the lives they lead today, thanks to important historical figures such as Lord Shaftesbury.

In PSHE we have been discussing staying safe when out and about. The children have shown great understanding and maturity when discussing our 'Clever Never Goes' rule of 'If you don't know the person or the plan has not been agreed by a parent or carer then you don't go'

To change colour like a chameleon and to fall through the sky.





Treatment: Give seriously ill patients antibiotics to kill off the bacteria.
