### A message from Mrs Mould...

Dear Parents/Carers

Another lovely week across both schools! It has been a real pleasure this week to talk to children about their learning and to hear them talk with such confidence and enthusiasm!

In our assemblies each week, we are beginning to learn more about Federation Values—Respect, Kindness and Resilience. To begin with we have focused on Respect. In Science we have been thinking about the changes to trees across the seasons and have used our fingers to print leaves on four different trees.




In PE this week we have been playing 'Snake Tag' which was an exciting way to begin to learn about skills in tag rugby.





## Our Learning This Week.....Class 2


