# Our Learning This Week.....Class 2

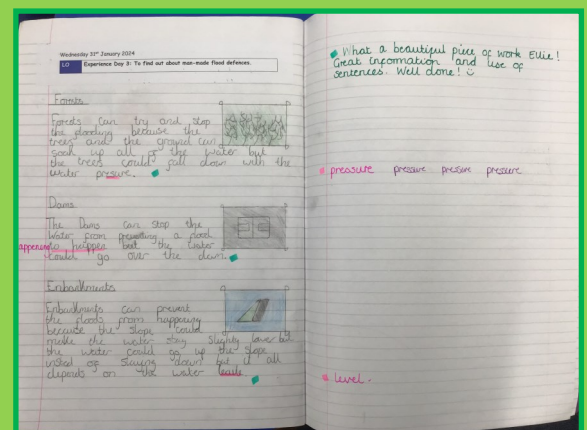
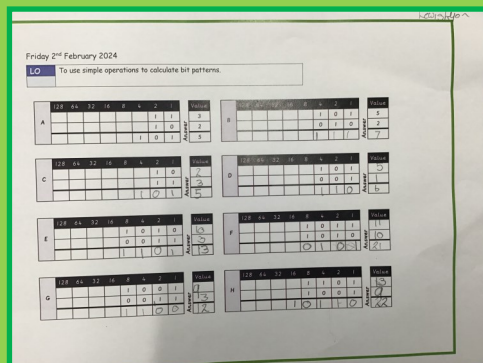
## What a busy week in Class 2!

We have completed our history unit on the Anglo Saxons, which culminated in a rather heated discussion about who should have replaced Edward the Confessor and there was a mixed response when we found out it was actually William the Conqueror!

In English, we have continued our writing about floods and have spent time researching flood defences. The children have created such beautiful pieces of work showing their research. We have added two new books to our reading journey and found the life of Katherine Johnson and her work for NASA truly out of this world.

In computing, we have looked again at how to stay safe online and year 5 and 6 have been learning to add binary code. If they come home and tell you that  $1 + 1 = 0$  and you exchange the 1, they are absolutely correct! It is difficult to learn a new way of using numbers when all you have ever known is the decimal system!
